Liturgical Calendar

Mon 11 March: *Opt. Comm.* of **St Constantine** who was King of Cornwall. After his wife’s death he converted to Christianity and entered monastic life as a penance for his earlier sins. There he encountered St Kentigern who encouraged him to share his Faith. He founded a monastery in Govan, from where he and his monks preached the Gospel of Christ. He met a martyr’s death and was buried in Govan in 590.

Wed 13 March: Anniversary of the election of **Pope Francis**, 2013

Fri 15 March: *Opt. Comm.* of **St Polycarp** a 2nd-century Christian bishop of Smyrna. He died a martyr, bound and burned at the stake, then stabbed when the fire failed to touch him. Polycarp is regarded as a saint and Church Father in the Eastern Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox, Catholic, Anglican, and Lutheran churches.

Luke 4:1-13
