Liturgical Calendar

Tues 14 May: **Feast of St Matthias**, who was chosen by lot in the Acts of the Apostles (1:15-26) to replace Judas as an Apostle. After Pentecost he worked first in Judaea before going to Cappadocia and Georgia.

Sat 18 May: Opt. Memorial of **Pope St John I**, who was elected pope in 523 AD. Already frail, he was prevailed upon by King Theodoric to go on a mission to the Emperor Justin, then based in Constantinople, in relation to the Arian controversy still afflicting the Church after two centuries. Although largely successful, on his return the king accused him of conspiring with the emperor against him and had him put in prison, where he died, circa 526 AD.

First reading

Acts 13:14,43-52

Paul and Barnabas carried on from Perga till they reached Antioch in Pisidia. Here they went to synagogue on the Sabbath and took their seats.

When the meeting broke up many Jews and devout converts joined Paul and Barnabas, and in their talks with them Paul and Barnabas urged them to remain faithful to the grace God had given them.

The next sabbath almost the whole town assembled to hear the word of God. When they saw the crowds, the Jews, prompted by jealousy, used blasphemies and contradicted everything Paul said. Then Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly. 'We had to proclaim the word of God to you first, but since you have rejected it, since you do not think yourselves worthy of eternal life, we must turn to the pagans. For this is what the Lord commanded us to do when he said:

I have made you a light for the nations, so that my salvation may reach the ends of the earth.'

It made the pagans very happy to hear this and they thanked the Lord for his message; all who were destined for eternal life became believers. Thus the word of the Lord spread through the whole countryside.

But the Jews worked upon some of the devout women of the upper classes and the leading men of the city and persuaded them to turn against Paul and Barnabas and expel them from their territory. So they shook the dust from their feet in defiance and went

off to Iconium; but the disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.
